Coordinated Family Care, Middlesex County's Care Management Organization (CMO), is making available **\$67,697.00** to community-based service providers who are interested in expanding/enhancing/creating services in the following areas of need:

**Suicide Prevention & Supportive Services:** Highlighting community awareness of the subject while creating safe spaces that offer youth and families support in various ways.

**I/DD Social/Recreational Programming:** Inclusive services focusing on expressive arts with emphasis on social interactions, and movement when applicable, for varied abilities or needs.

**Health Care Systems as Social Determinants of Health to Improve the Overall Well-Being of Families:** Expand healthcare coverage/access by increasing provider availability, while intensifying the quality of care in the community.

**Food Insecurity:** Bridging a gap with local food banks or pantries to enhance their ability to include and serve more of the county while being able to also directly identify and serve Children's System of Care (CSOC) families in need.

**Juvenile Justice Intervention:** Services aimed at youth, both involved and not yet involved in the juvenile justice system to reduce incarceration and recidivism rates.

Applicants may apply within every category, as well as a combination of the areas of need. Programming must take place in Middlesex County. Currently funded Department of Children and Families (DCF) services/programs are excluded.

***\*All Proposals are to include Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion - as it relates to creating and enhancing access to cohesive services for youth and families within Middlesex County. This is required within the "Proposed Project Description."***
